

1 MS. RICH: All right. Thank you. Mr.  
2 Dailey, you go to Belhaven College?

3 PJ DAILEY: Belhaven.

4 MS. RICH: Is that right, Belhaven?

5 PJ DAILEY: Yes, ma'am.

6 MS. RICH: Is that in Jackson, Mississippi?

7 PJ DAILEY: Yes, ma'am.

8 MS. RICH: Okay. Gosh, you're here; are you  
9 on Springbreak or something?

10 PJ DAILEY: I'm taking masters right now, my  
11 masters.

12 MS. RICH: You're getting your masters?

13 PJ DAILEY: Yes, ma'am.

14 MS. RICH: Do you do on-line classes for your  
15 masters?

16 PJ DAILEY: Yes, ma'am.

17 MS. RICH: Okay. So I guess I'm just asking  
18 because I'm concerned, would you be able to keep up  
19 with your schoolwork if you were called to serve on  
20 a jury in this particular case?

21 PJ DAILEY: It'll be hard.

22 MS. RICH: I understand it would be hard, and  
23 I think you're being very responsive to what the  
24 judge said about jury duty is often times very  
25 hard. I just want to make sure that you would be

1       able to keep up with your schoolwork and serve on  
2       the jury?

3               PJ DAILEY: I wouldn't be able to.

4               MS. RICH: You wouldn't be able to?

5               PJ DAILEY: No, ma'am.

6               MS. RICH: Thank you, Mr. Dailey. And what  
7       are you getting your masters in?

8               PJ DAILEY: Business.

9               MS. RICH: Business. Okay, Judge, that's all  
10       I have.

11              THE COURT: We're going to take a break in  
12       just a minute. But I want to give some names out  
13       and I want to ask these folks to stay behind so we  
14       can just have a few individual private discussions.  
15       And nobody is in any trouble, the judge is calling  
16       me up to talk to me, it's fine. Everything's good.  
17       This is just follow-up and sometimes things are  
18       better talked about privately.

19              So I'm going to ask Mr. McKinney, number 9,  
20       Ms. Nathan, number 10, Mr. Dailey, number 20, Ms.  
21       Kidd, number 25, Mr. Moore, number 27, Mr. Riley,  
22       number 29, and Mr. Stinson, number 60. If you would  
23       just stay behind and let us bring you up privately  
24       one by one. The rest of you guys, I'm going to  
25       put you on a little bit of an extended break.
