MS. RICH: If you need to stop -- MS. THOMAS: Okay.

Thank you, Your Honor. The statement's from her father and I. Respect, Honorable Court today, we, absolutely, request that this motion be denied on all counts, that there is no modification to the conditions of release, therefore, set by this Court in the case of Samantha Thomas' death due to Mr. Nakhla's inherent lack -- to human life and recklessness on Oct -- August 1, 2020, causing the horrific and sudden fatality of our daughter, whom was in her third year of medical school and top in her class.

The hippocratic oath is an important step in becoming a doctor. Medical students must take the hippocratic oath. And one of the promises within that oath is, first, do no harm, that comes out of the original Latin translation by Hippocrates.

Mr. Nakhla put his medical license at risk when, first, do no harm, he chose to get behind the wheel of an Audi Spider; drove under the influence of alcohol at a reckless rate of speed -- estimated 138 miles per hour -- with

disregard to human life in his passenger seat.

The oath of doctors at graduation recite and promise to adhere to this oath and it includes

in their work hours and, also, in their off

hours as a physician.

Causing the decapitation of Samantha Thomas and her immediate demise, Mr. Nakhla has no one to blame for these actions, other than his own, and poor choice. He has no medical license and income. He gave up his freedoms, along with that, that evening.

As the Honorable Court has previously decided on those conditions of release, after the Grand Jury's charges, Mr. Nakhla can surely find other means of income from his home; people do it every day.

As for the rental, there are management companies, family and friends to assist in this matter. We firmly believe this gives him too many freedoms and accommodations set from the criminal charges brought against him, as the Court already has in place, waiting for trial. Mr. Nakhla is the sole reason that Samantha Thomas is unable to graduate from medical school with her classmates. She was unable to

get her medical license; unable to practice medicine as a anesthesiologist of her dreams; unable to enjoy family and friends with life, in general; unable to attend our family vacations, holidays and birthdays; unable to give to the community in research and medicine of her passions that she's been doing for years; unable to have a husband and children to aid in providing for her family unit; unable to be maid of honor in her planned sister and her stepsister's weddings.

Mr. Nakhla has robbed her family and friends of the beauty of her presence and her infectious smile as she loved and cared for the human, nature, and animals. He has robbed her father and stepmother of grandchildren and a son-in-law, her overall presence in our family life. No holidays and celebrations have been the same, of course, and impacted forever.

Your Honor, at her sister's wedding and stepsister's wedding, we had to be reminded as the table had her picture on it, as her life had been so recklessly taken.

Samantha is missing life, Your Honor. Mr.

Nakhla robbed the future generation of a doctor

and a healer. Your Honor, this list will get longer as the years pass. As nothing will bring our Samantha back, we humbly request that no changes be made to Mr. Nakhla's condition of release, as the Court has already set in place, and, respectfully, deny this motion today. We respectfully request the trial be as soon as possible for some closure for all families involved. With great respect, Your Honor, her dad, Harold, and I, Christiana. Thank you.

MS. THOMAS: Thank you.

THE COURT: Any other speakers?

MS. RICH: No, Your Honor. We have nothing else. We just are adamantly opposed to this.

DEFENSE COUNSEL MR. KNIZLEY: Yes, sir.

Judge, we're here on a rule 7 motion. And
